How Information and Communication Technologies are used to assist learning

As a school committed to contemporary learning, ICLT is an integral part of the dynamic learning experience at MMK. All of our classrooms are equipped with Interactive Whiteboards. The entire school site is serviced by an integrated wireless network to support the use of mobile technology. All classrooms have desktop computers, iPods and iPads and several banks of laptop computers are used throughout the school. During their schooling, students become familiar with both Apple and PC platforms and a wide range of a applications. Our teachers undertake extensive ongoing professional development and are committed to ensuring that all students are given the skills to engage effectively as global citizens.

A 1:1 laptop program is now fully operational across Years 4 to 6, supporting personalised learning for all students.

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
Policy and practice to manage student attendance
