5 things you can do within the school!

- 3. volunteer to go on excursions
- 4. come along to classroom prayer mornings
- 5. volunteer to help out with the grounds team, be on the mowing roster

5 things you can do if you are a parent with little kids!

- 1. come along to our Parent Meet & Greet (little ones a welcome addition!) – look out for these details in school newsletter
- 2. hook up with another parent with small kids and take turns babysitting so you can enjoy reading with your child's class or do a stint at the tuckshop (or go for a coffee at Carindale!). Don't know anyone? Then see your class rep and ask for help with some introductions!
- 3. cover library books
- 4. take your kids to the children's liturgy at Sunday mass
- 5. **chill out** and don't worry about not being able to help out your time will come

Many of our families are aware of how most of our P&F activities are run but for new families and those who may not have been able to help in the past it may be a mystery! Here's some more detailed information to help you understand about our **Mowing Group**, **Casserole Club**, **Class Rep** network, **School Banking** service, **Walking School Bus**, **Tuckshop**, **Uniform Shop** and **Library**.

MOWING GROUP

The mowing group is an extremely important part of the grounds crew, as they help maintain the lawns around the school buildings and help the school save thousands on external mowers. For those of you that have not done it before, don't worry it's a breeze. All the mowing equipment is provided, and it is only 1-2 hours, 3-4 times a year – that's all!!! Get a group of friends together and help out.

Mowing is in teams of 4-5 people and we can group friends together. There are approx. 12 groups so you only mow maybe 3-4 times per year. We try to avoid school & public holidays. Mowing times are Sat 7.30am, Sat 3.30pm and Sunday 3.30pm, although groups can co-ordinate their own time outside of church mass times if it suits. Mowing takes about 1-2hrs depending on the time of year. Mowers and fuel are supplied by the school. Each group has a team leader to open shed and organise the group. It's very easy and takes so little time to make the school neat & tidy. <u>Contact Details</u>: Vacant

CASSEROLE CLUB

The Casserole Club is one of our Pastoral Care activities and consists of wonderful volunteers who cook meals to be distributed to families in our School Community at a time when they could benefit from a home cooked meal e.g. a time of illness or birth of a child or just because they're doing it tough. As a volunteer, you will periodically receive a letter requesting you to make a meal (approx twice a year). If you know of any family who could benefit from a meal, you simply advise Sally or Stephanie and they will ensure a meal(s) is sent home via the classroom or delivered to the family home.

5 Easy Steps

- Receive a letter from the Casserole Club to cook a meal (you don't need to wait for a letter if you wish)
- Collect a container from the School Office
- Make the meal/soup of your choice and fill the container
- Be sure to label the container with ingredients, date prepared and heating instructions
- Return your meal to the School Office where it will be placed in the freezer

CLASS REPS

A Class Representative is someone who volunteers to act as a key point of contact in their class particularly in terms of promoting communication between the families of their class, their teacher, the school & our P&F committee.

As Class Rep you may be involved in: assisting your teacher in drumming up support for a particular classroom activity; getting together with the other class reps in your grade to organise various social events throughout the year (family events, 'parent only' events, day/night times etc etc); helping to promote P&F events through your year level by sending a quick email to your class parents; or welcoming new class members to our school community.

Our Class Rep network forms part of our Parent Link P&F team and will have the support of the P&F team, particularly from our Parent Link Team Leaders.

SCHOOL BANKING

The St Mary MacKillop School Banking service was established by parents to help our children learn the art of saving their money through opening a bank account; making regular deposits and watching their savings grow. Our team of School Banking volunteers mans a desk outside the library from 8am every Thursday morning of school term. Children simply need to bring along their banking books and their money to deposit.

First time bankers will need to come along and grab an application form - this form needs to be completed and lodged with your local Commonwealth Bank to establish your child's account. It usually takes the bank a couple of weeks to create the account and then your child will be issued with their 'bank book' and they can start making deposits at school.

Children are welcome to make deposits as often as they like for any amount, be it 5c or \$5. Our school P&F receives fund raising income from school banking through a small percentage commission on deposits made.

WALKING SCHOOL BUS

A **Walking School Bus (WSB)** is a group of children walking to and/or from school with trained and approved (school volunteer registered and/or Blue Card) Walk Leaders from the school community. The 'bus' walks along a set route to and/or from school, picking up or dropping off children along the way at designated stops, similar to a normal bus route. Children who live on the WSB route can be picked up from their front door, and children who don't live along the route can have their parents/carers drop them off at a designated 'bus stop'. Following the successful completion of our trial last year we are looking to offer 2 WSB routes: 1) along Collingwood Rd (Birkdale Road end); and 2) along Marlborough Road.

Our MMK WSB helps to encourage an active lifestyle for our children, provides them with opportunities to develop other friendship networks, teaches & promotes road safety practices, helps reduce school traffic congestion by lessening the number of cars entering our grounds, and provides parents with alternate drop-off/pick-up points located outside our school grounds.

Our **WSB Coordinator** is responsible for the overall coordination of the WSB and liaises with the school to develop the most suitable routes, raise awareness of the program, develop and maintain a WSB Walk Leader roster, and to manage the student enrolment process.

We are currently seeking a replacement WSB Coordinator. This role involves a time commitment of approximately 2hrs per week and provides a invaluable service to our school community.

A **WSB Walk Leader** operates the WSB in a safe and efficient manner and safely supervises the WSB children getting them safely to and from school. They are familiar with the route including all stops and road crossings, and follow specific policies & procedures to ensure safety of our children is paramount. *We are currently seeking additional Walk Leaders.* These roles involve a time commitment of approximately 30mins per walk.

TUCKSHOP

Tuckshop operates 3 days per week - Monday, Wednesday & Friday.

The school teaches the children about the importance of eating balanced, nutritious foods through our "GO, GLOW & GROW" program. It is important for the tuckshop to support this program and as such, we continue to offer foods from the 'G0, GLOW & GROW' range to ensure good nutritional values for your kids!

Tuckshop is a fun and friendly environment and a great way to meet other parents. No experience is necessary and everyone is most welcome. Unfortunately, safety issues exclude toddlers. So if you are able to spare approximately three hours once a month from 8.30-11.30am on a Tuckshop day then please leave your details at the school office or contact <u>Cheryl Thompson</u> 0421 642 185. The tuckshop roster, once finalised, will be sent home via your child's class teacher.

UNIFORM SHOP

The Uniform Shop is open every week during term time as follows:

Tuesday	8.00 am – 9.30am
Wednesday	2.00pm - 3.30pm

If you are unable to make it to the Uniform Shop during its opening hours you may place your order in the Uniform Orders box located in the school office. Order forms available on school website or at the uniform shop. Please be aware that if you are placing cash in this box you are doing so at your own risk. Ideally this method should only be used for orders being paid for by credit card.
